Committee Approves Funding for State Projects: Recently, the Legislative Joint Bond Review Committee met and gave approval to over 49 state projects. All total, the committee approved 14 Phase 1 projects, which is the funding for the A/E Design, and 25 Phase 2 projects, which is the establishment of the construction budget for those projects. Of the Phase 1 projects, there was one project approved at each of the following: The Citadel, Clemson University, College of Charleston, Francis Marion University, Aiken Tech, Spartanburg Community College, and the Department of Corrections. There were also two projects approved at MUSC and five for the University of South Carolina. Of the Phase 2 projects, there was one project approved at each of the following: Francis Marion University, Tri-County Tech, Department of Corrections, Mental Health, and Clemson PSA. There were three projects approved for the College of Charleston, two projects each for Coastal Carolina, MUSC, Central Carolina Tech, and SCDOT, and nine projects approved at the University of South Carolina.
