

Current Orders Restrict Daily Business

In recent days, many state and local authorities in NC have issued orders restricting daily business activities. These orders vary from place to place and restrict construction in different ways. CAGC recommends that contractors review each order carefully, consult with counsel to evaluate the effect of the order on a specific project, and confer with vendors, subcontractors, and owners to plan operations on a project-by-project basis. While the orders may partially or completely exempt construction or treat construction as an "essential" business operations, they still generally impose social distancing requirements. Continued operation requires compliance with supplemental regulations related to COVID-19 and local orders. CAGC recommends that contractors consult with counsel to evaluate these restrictions and the potential liabilities of continuing operations in the field.
